In case you just moved here from out of town or have been living under a rock, Parish, a Terrell Hills City Council member, has owned and operated Parish Photography, one of San Antonio's most successful businesses of its kind for nearly 50 years.

And like his young protégé, he stumbled upon his success by accident.

After a stint in the U.S. Army, followed by receiving his degree in finance from Trinity University, Parish decided to "take a few pictures" until he found a job in banking.

So why sell to someone half the age of his business?

"I had been looking for someone to take over," explained Parish of his fateful meeting with Lyde, also a graduate of Trinity University.

"I met Jenna-Beth at an Alamo Heights Chamber of Commerce meeting. She came to work for me to handle the business end of things and, before I knew it, I was taking orders from her. She does things the modern way and I do things the traditional way and it all worked out."

As for owning a wildly successful business in her early 20s, Lyde feels like it's an exciting and overwhelming time in her life. She is eager to expand the business using social media, the Internet and some new marketing strategies as well as continue to maintain the Parish name and reputation.

Lyde, is, quite simply, a ball of fire. She is more than happy to stand in the background and play straight man to Parish, who she refers to as "Mr. P." In fact, she relishes in it. They aim to position themselves as a fun, fantastic team.

Parish put in the contract that she can't fire him and added, "Now I can come to work late." At the ripe old age of 74, with the help of his new "boss," Parish even has his own blog called "A Bride Idea: Anecdotes of an Old, Grouchy Wedding Photographer."

Parish, the personification of determination, continues to photograph his fingers to the bone.
